The primary force behind having the JRAR up and running is to provide peace of mind during times of disaster, evacuation and emergencies. It is our belief that one main factor in people choosing to delay an evacuation is the scrambling to take care of non-human family members. If we can eliminate the scrambling, help members make concrete plans and be proactive to make sure no animal is forgotten then this delay can be eliminated as well.

The process, for us, begins in times of NON-emergency. This is when we have an opportunity to work on the following steps:

Education - from trailer loading to first aid to tips on capturing an outdoor cat and so on - education is the foundation upon which all else is built

Planning - buddy system call lists, pre-signing ALERT authorizations, arranging accommodations for misplaced pets and organizing for special needs animals

Information Flow - for community members to have the assurance that an organization (ALERT) is well informed, organized and dispatched where needed and having information flow back to the residents in a timely fashion would take much of the stress off of the families

It is the goal of the JRAR to build a program that will touch on all of these aspects of animal care and to help when help is needed. Ongoing efforts to ensure and strengthen the security and confidentiality of the JRAR Registrant information will be a primary objective in the coming months. Development of clear policies, protocols and procedures are being developed both for during emergency and non-emergencies alike.
